

A spit boy's job was to turn meat on a large spit over a blazing fire for sometimes twelve hours. A spit boy's job was the lowest of the low. In a large kitchen it was very rare for a boy to be turning the spit, but if it was a smaller kitchen then it would've been a boy turning the spit. Not only was the occupation mind-numbingly boring, but it was quite dangerous. If a spit boy was showing a lot of their body, then the fire would burn it in minutes.

Number 7 - A Boy Actor


You might think that a boy actor was a very decent job in those days, especially when you were working with Shakespeare! But it wasn't. It was the law that women were not allowed to act, so the men would have had to have played the women roles as well as the men ones. The makeup they wore was made out of lead and crushed beetles. The lead was extremely effective to give a pale face to the actors, but it was really poisonous. It would give sores to anyone who wore it. The beetles were used as red lipstick. It was harmless, but couldn't have tasted very nice. Not only makeup was deadly, but the clothes were too. The waist on a dress was tightened so the actors looked as skinny as possible, but it gave the actors seriously bad bruises. Boy actors were apprentices so didn't get paid, but worked for their keep. Boy actors died very young due to the poor conditions of their jobs.

Number 6 - Leech Collector


Whoever had this unfortunate job would've had to walk into swamps or marshes and let a bucket full of blood-sucking leeches cling to their legs. They then would have to pull the leeches of their legs and put them in a metal bucket. Leech collectors were not paid very much at all and many died from serious blood loss.


Number 5 - The Groom Of The Stool

This the highest job in the royal household. The groom of the stool's job was to wipe the King's bottom after they had used the privy. The groom of the stool had a lot of power from his revolting job, because only the most aristocratic people were allowed by the royal buttocks. The royal diet would have mainly been meat and the King would've become very constipated. Part of the groom of the stool's job was to use laxatives and administer an enema to bring the King's waste out.









Before indigo was imported from the east in the 16th century, the only source of blue dye was woad, a plant which is a member of the cabbage family that was brought to Britain by the Celts. This process took ages and was very smelly indeed. The woad had to be fermented and dried into woad balls. This made a smell like rotten cabbage and sewage. The dried woad had to be put in a vat of wee and boiled at 51 degrees centigrade for three days. They then would take it out of the vat and leave to turn blue in oxygen. The stench was so terrible that Queen Elizabeth I ordered the woad dyers not only to stop work completely before she entered a town, but they could not come within five miles or where she was staying.

Number 3 - Executioner

If you were an executioner then you would not have been a very popular person. Your job was to decapitate criminals' heads. When someone was sentenced to death for treason they were usually sent to the block, where the executioner would chop off their head with an axe, then hold it up and shout "Behold the head of a traitor, so die all traitors!" The executioner's job became even more disgusting when they had to part-boil the heads in cumin and salt, so when they stick the head on a spike the crows won't go and steal it. Executioners were paid a reasonable amount of money and were allowed to keep their own heads.

Number 2 - Gong farmers

A Gong farmer's job was to clean poo off the streets. In the Tudor era there were no such things as sewers and drainage systems, so when the civilians needed the use of a privy they would do their business and then throw their excrement out of the window, that's when the gong farmers came in. They would shovel up the poo and put it in a bucket, then dump the poo in lakes, rivers the sea. The stink killed many gong farmers and bothered the civilians, so they had to live on the outskirts of town.

Number 1 - Fish Wives

Fish wives were ladies that were sent out on the streets to sell fish. They had to be mouthy and loud. But in the Tudor era women were not allowed to shout or talk to men so when they tried to do their job they were punished. They had almost a metal cage tied around there head with a blunt spike resting on their tongue. They then were dragged around the village were all there locals would come and push and laugh at her. But if she didn't stop being loud and doing her job then they were dunked in a river 20 or 30 times to test whether she was a witch or not. Global warming caused by pollution has begun to affect us directly, with climate change starting to affect British weather. Some people believe the time has come for drastic action to reduce pollution caused by heavy traffic.

There is no doubt that traffic fumes are a major cause of pollution throughout the developed world, and are a particular problem in large towns and cities. In a small country like the UK, cities are close enough together to cause high levels of traffic fume pollution in the air over large areas of the land. Consequently, health problems are created such as asthma, which has rapidly increased as the number of cars on the road has risen. An additional problem in urban areas is congestion, which wastes time and adds to costs. The average speed of traffic in central London is now only 12 miles an hour, the same as it was in Victorian times. A ban on cars in the centre of large towns and cities would therefore seem sensible as it would cut pollution thereby improving health. It would also reduce congestion, allowing buses, emergency vehicles and delivery trucks to be more efficient.



Fairtrade is a charity set up to provide money for the less fortunate people in Africa. It gives a small percentage of money from the Fairtrade product to the farmers. But a wide majority aren't buying Fairtrade produce due to the large expense of buying Fairtrade products.
