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### **The Pupil Deprivation Grant (PDG)**

The **Pupil Deprivation Grant (PDG)** is the Welsh Government's principal means of supporting schools to reduce the impact of a disadvantaged background on the educational attainment of pupils who receive Free School Meals (FSM) or who are Looked After Children (LAC).

The PDG is intended to overcome the additional barriers that some learners face which prevent them from attaining as well as their peers, whatever their ability.

### **PDG Allocation 2015-2016 - £8,400**

#### **Strategies**

The strategies being implemented are:

- targeting pupils based upon teacher assessments by employing additional staff
- investing in educational resources to enhance curriculum provision.

#### **Impact of 2015-16 work**

In 2015-16 the results for learners who qualified for support through the PDG showed 3/6 50% of pupils made improvement in their reading age. This is a positive result.
