### The 'National Model' for Regional School Improvement Services

As you probably know, the Welsh Government is about to launch the above Model, which will be universal across the four consortia in Wales. Over time, the Model hopes to deliver an increasing number of school improvement services on a regional level. We very much hope that this will increase GwE's capacity to offer higher levels of support to schools, especially so through promoting school to school support. The education system needs to take full advantage of the expertise that is to be found in our schools for the benefit of every child. It is also the intention of the Government to create one national model for school categorisation and, as we understand it, this will replace the current 'matrix'. When the Model is released, it is essential that our schools have an influence on the process of its effective delivery here in North Wales.





### **Literacy and Numeracy Support**

### **Literacy and Numeracy Associate Partners**

#### **Background**

Since September 2013 seven Literacy and Numeracy Associate Partners (AP) have been working with specific schools within the north Wales region. These individuals have been identified as outstanding practitioners that would support the schools of the region to implement the Literacy and Numeracy Frameworks. This work was aligned with support that would be available to each school with sponsorship from the National Support Programme. AP support is targeted to those schools where there is a greater need.

#### Referring schools for support

The process of referring applications for support has worked well this term. This occurred in one of two ways via the Senior System Leader who co-ordinates the work:

- via the NSP Partners who have completed the agreed referral form following a visit to the school concerned
- via the school's System Leader or the Senior System Leader

At the beginning of the term the number of applications for support was less. During this time the AP used their non-contact time to:

- prepare exemplar material to share with schools
- meet with each other to agree on consistent approaches across the region
- become familiar with NSP support materials
- prepare and present training for volunteers on how to support pupils' reading and numeracy skills

Also during this time, the AP visited some schools that were facing an imminent inspection to check their LNF implementation plans. These were individual visits in nearly all instances with no need for follow-up. These applications were made by the SL or the SSL.
