Joining with glue



STAGES OF DEVELOPMENT IN GLUING - GLUE STICK

DESCRIPTION OF STAGE

ADULT SUPPORT AND RESOURCES

Puts glue on base sheet of paper randomly and places smaller pieces of paper anywhere (not specifically on glued area).

Adult - Provides glue stick and dark paper to ensure glue can be seen when applied. Models how to put smaller pieces of paper directly onto glue.

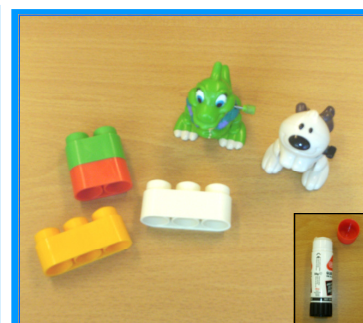
Resources - glue stick, dark base sheet of paper, smaller pieces of paper.



Removes lid and twists glue stick.

Adult - Models how to get glue stick ready for use. Not too much out of top. Wind down glue stick. Push lid back on.

Resources - Glue stick, objects/toys which encourage fine motor skills push, pull, twist e.g. Poly M, wind-up toys.



Puts glue randomly on paper and places materials on glued area.

Adult - Provides collage materials which will stick easily onto paper.

Resources - glue stick, tissue paper, cellophane, foil.



Puts glue and materials on paper with increasing control.

Adult - Provides wider variety of materials for child to freely explore and experiment with.

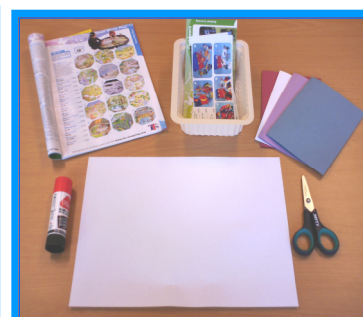
Resources - glue, various materials e.g. wool, sequins.



Puts glue directly onto small pieces of paper and sticks onto base sheet of paper.

Adult - Encourages child to cut/tear their own small pieces of paper to glue. Encourages child to put these pieces flat onto table surface to apply glue.

Resources - glue, variety of paper, old magazines and catalogues, scissors.



STAGES OF DEVELOPMENT IN GLUING - USING OTHER GLUES

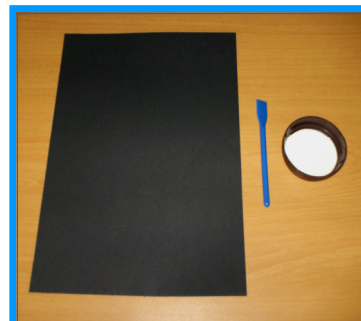
DESCRIPTION OF STAGE

ADULT SUPPORT AND RESOURCES

Prepares to use PVA glue - holds the glue spatula, scooping the glue out of a pot, drizzling the glue onto the paper, spreading the glue out

Adult - Models holding the glue spatula, scooping the glue out of a pot, scraping the spatula against the side of the pot, putting the glue onto the paper where required and spreading it out.

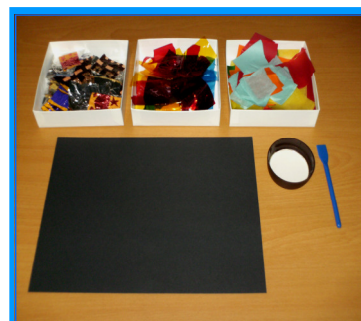
Resources - PVA glue, glue spreader, glue pot, dark paper



Puts glue randomly on paper and places materials on glued area.

Adult - Provides collage materials which will stick easily onto paper.

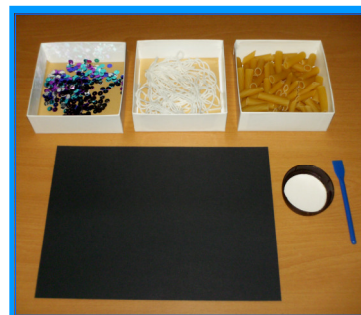
Resources - glue stick, tissue paper, cellophane, foil.



Puts glue and materials on paper with increasing control.

Adult - Provides wider variety of materials for child to freely explore and experiment with.

Resources - glue, various materials e.g. wool, sequins, pasta.



Puts glue directly onto small pieces of paper and sticks onto base sheet of paper.

Adult - Encourages child to cut/tear their own small pieces of paper to glue. Encourages child to put these pieces flat onto table surface to apply glue.

Resources - glue, variety of paper, old magazines and catalogues, scissors.



Selects the appropriate glue for a specific purpose.

Adult - Provides a range of glues and applicators. Encourages experimentation and problem solving. Supports child when evaluating their choices.

Resources - wide range of glues and different workshop resources.



STAGES OF DEVELOPMENT IN JOINING (1)

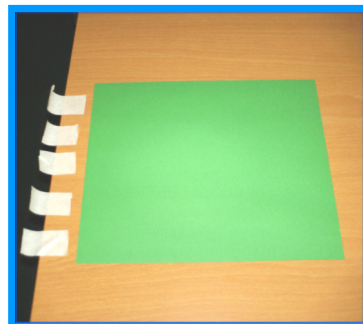
DESCRIPTION OF STAGE

ADULT SUPPORT AND RESOURCES

Sticks tape randomly onto base sheet of paper and discovers the sticking properties of tape.

Adult - Provides pieces of tape, e.g. masking tape. Shows how to press tape onto paper.

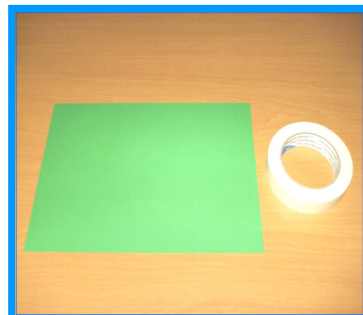
Resources - Paper to stick tape onto, pieces of masking tape.



Tears pieces of masking tape

Adult - Provides easy to tear tape e.g. masking tape. Models how to tear and supports the child.

Resources - Paper to stick tape onto, masking tape.



Uses the tape dispenser.

Adult - Models how to use sticky tape dispenser safely. Supervises child.

Resources - Sturdy table top tape dispenser, range of tape, paper.



Sticks smaller pieces of paper onto base sheet of paper using tape.

Adult - Models how to connect small pieces of paper onto base sheet of paper.

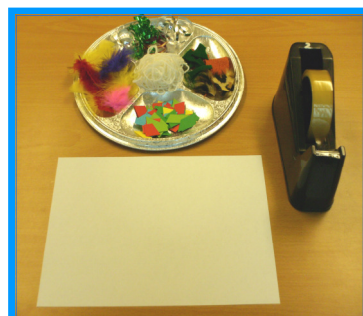
Resources - Large and small pieces of paper, range of tape.



Uses clear tape to stick other resources onto paper.

Adult - Provides a selection of resources that children can tape onto paper.

Resources - Tape (clear) feathers, string, leaves, ribbon, small pieces of fabric, card, paper.

STAGES OF DEVELOPMENT IN JOINING (2)

DESCRIPTION OF STAGE

ADULT SUPPORT AND RESOURCES

Uses tape to join two pieces of paper alongside each other.

Adult - Supports child to explore and experiment joining pieces of paper with tape.
Resources - Tape, paper of assorted sizes.



Explores and experiments with different tapes for joining 2D and 3D resources together.

Adult - Supports child to explore and experiment.
Resources - Choice of tapes, 2D and 3D resources.



Uses tape to join together 3D objects.

Adult - Assists child to manipulate, position and stick objects.
Resources - Choice of tapes, 3D objects.



Chooses the appropriate tape for the purpose.

Adult - Supports child as they become familiar with the different properties of different tapes.
Resources - Wide range of tapes and resources.
