Ysgol Derwenfa Schools' Pupil Deprivation Grant statement

The purpose of the Pupil Deprivation grant is to improve the educational attainment of pupils from low income families and who are entitled to free school meals (eFSM). Schools are expected to maximise the use of the funding by introducing sustainable strategies which will quickly lead to improved outcomes for pupils entitles to free school meals.

As a school, we want to learn from the best practice in Wales and beyond by:

- 1. planning interventions that focus on improving the attainment of pupils from deprived backgrounds, regularly monitoring pupils' progress and evaluating the impact of the intervention
- 2. Integrating plans for the effective use of the PDG into the school Development plan, basing our practice on sound evidence and including them as part of a whole school strategy.
- 3. Balancing whole school strategies with targeted interventions to ensure that all learners entitled to free school meals benefit as individuals, whilst the whole school also develops its ability to support every learner to achieve their full potential.

In 2016 /17 Ysgol Derwenfa were allocated a total Pupil Deprivation Grant of £25300

Ysgol Derwenfa has a comprehensive plan, agreed and monitored by GwE and Flintshire Local authority, to promote high expectations attainment and progress and to remove barriers to learning for pupils entitled to this funding.

We have used the funding available to:

- TA deployed to work for 5 afternoons a week to support FSM pupil
- Release of ALNCo for 1 day a week to work with FSM and vulnerable pupils to deliver targeted enrichment activities to close the gap and raise levels of attainment of FSM, LAC and vulnerable pupils
- TA deployed full time to work with groups of pupils of FSM, LAC and vulnerable pupils in the foundation phase to close the gap and raise levels of attainment
- TA deployed to work for 5 mornings a week to support FSM pupil

It is not appropriate for the school to publish a detailed plan as it could identify individual pupils.
