

Once FP and KS2 teacher had looked at each other's schemes, a decision was made to follow up on the thematic success of the FP and roll this out to weekly activities from year 3 to 6, in preparation for the new curriculum.

Here is an example of a scheme for one of the areas within the topic. SC have been differentiated at four levels to accommodate the ability range in class, where every pupil has been assigned a specific colour group (from year 3 to 6).

Work is differentiated at the child's ability – a MAT child from Year 3 can be in the same group as a child in Year 5. See above for breakdown of four year groups, the numeracy and literacy skills to be developed in the area and also the associated ICT skills.

#### Example of area: Writing area


The task: finding distances of areas in China from each other: measuring in cm and mm before converting to km, organising the answers to find the furthest/nearest.








The task: Working in groups – cooperating and working in a team to create a dragon for the Chinese dance!

Pupils' work seen here, where more than one area has been covered. Pupils are expected to read a map of China/Asia and use the key to find the distances of Chinese cities from one another.

- An element of independent working, and group work, was very effective.


#### Next steps?
