



## **Datganiad Grant Dysgu Proffesiynol Ysgol David Hughes 2019-2020**

Bydd y cyllid hwn yn helpu Ysgol David Hughes i fodloni gofynion y Dull Cenedlaethol ar gyfer Dysgu Proffesiynol newydd ac yn fodd i fuddsoddi yn elfennau'r model. Galluoga hyn i'r ysgol fuddsoddi mewn llwybrau dysgu proffesiynol ar gyfer ymarferwyr a buddsoddi mewn cydweithrediad. Prif ddefnydd y cyllid fydd creu amser i ymarferwyr wneud y newidiadau i arferion sydd eu hangen cyn gwireddu'r cwricwlwm newydd.

Bydd y cyllid yn targedu'r dysgu sydd ei angen ar athrawon a dysgwyr i'w paratoi ar gyfer y cwricwlwm newydd a bydd pob ymarferydd, athrawon a chymorthyddion, yn cael cyfle i gymryd rhan mewn dysgu proffesiynol. Defnyddir y cyllid i gefnogi dysgu proffesiynol ar y cyd ar draws ysgolion gan gynnwys y sector gynradd.

Yn unol â hyn, bydd y cyllid yn cael ei ddefnyddio i gefnogi y canlynol:

- rhyddhau athrawon a chymorthyddion dysgu i gymryd rhan mewn gweithgareddau dysgu proffesiynol;
- talu unigolion, gan greu rolau a swyddi, i gefnogi'r gwaith o gydlynu gweithgareddau DP ar draws yr ysgol. Bydd hyn yn cynnwys cefnogi cydweithwyr, adrannau neu ddulliau gweithredu ysgol gyfan gydag ymholi beirniadol, rheoli newid a gweithgareddau YSD
- costau rhyddhau er mwyn i ymarferwyr gymryd rhan mewn gweithgareddau ymchwil ac ymholi beirniadol, gan ariannu amser rhyddhau i ymchwilio i oblygiadau'r cwricwlwm newydd ar gyfer eu harfer addysgu ac asesu eu hunain
- costau rhyddhau i alluogi ymarferwyr i gydweithio yn yr ysgol ac ar draws clystyrau a rhwydweithiau ysgolion - gan gymryd rhan mewn dysgu proffesiynol ar y cyd a chynllunio ar y cyd

## **Professional Learning Grant Statement 2019-20 for Ysgol David Hughes**

The funding will help Ysgol David Hughes meet the demands of the new National Approach to Professional Learning (NAPL) and enable investment in the elements of the model. It will enable investment in practitioners' individual professional learning journeys and investment in collaboration. The primary purpose of the funding is creating time in schools for practitioners to make the changes to practice they need to make in advance of the realisation of the new curriculum.

The funding will be targeted at the learning required by teachers and learners to prepare them for the new curriculum and every practitioner, teachers and LSA, will be given the opportunity to engage with professional learning

The funding will be utilised to support engagement with the regional professional learning offer and to support professional learning collaboration across schools including the local primary schools.

In line with this, the funding will be used to support the following: -

- the general release of teachers and TAs to engage in professional learning activities; -
- the remuneration of individuals, creating roles and posts, to support the co-ordination of PL activities across a school or group of schools. These roles would support colleagues, departments or whole school approaches to critical enquiry, change management and SLO activities; -
- the release costs for practitioners to engage in research activities and critical enquiry, funding release time to investigate the implications of the new curriculum for their own teaching and assessment practice;
- the release costs to enable practitioners to collaborate both within school and across clusters and networks of schools – engaging with collaborative professional learning and collaborative planning; -
