Development Programmes

NPQH 2020-21 - Assessment Only Model - CLOSING DATE: 18/09/2020

Given the current circumstances and the effect on the usual processes for the NPQH assessment, an additional **NPQH – Assessment Only** model is available for the 2020-21 academic year. This is specifically to support those school leaders who are on the cusp of headship and expecting to apply for headship within the next 12 months. It is intended for those practitioners who are ready for assessment **now** and does not include any developmental support. Applicants will need to secure the endorsement of their Headteacher and of their region. Click **here** for further information about the process etc.

If you wish to follow a programme leading to the NPQH qualification but are not on the cusp of headship, you should consider following the developmental pathway by applying for the following programme:

National Aspiring Headteacher Development Programme - Preparing for NPOH 2021-22

This one-year development programme is a professional learning opportunity for experienced school leaders who wish to become Headteachers in the future. Completion of this 5-day programme is an expectation for gaining access to NPQH assessment in 2022. Newly Qualified Teachers (NQT) Induction

In 2020-21, there will be **significant** changes to induction regulations, and it will be more important than ever for every school Induction Mentor (IM), NQT and External Verifier (EV) to engage in one of the national training/briefing sessions. There will be a range of bespoke online sessions for each role.

[Schools should appoint an IM to attend a session even if they have not currently recruited a teacher who will be newly qualified in September, since most schools employ NQTs at some point during the academic year].

Implementation of the Additional Learning Needs system

The Minister for Education has published a <u>statement</u> on the progress of the Additional Learning Needs (ALN) transformation programme.

Throughout the Covid-19 pandemic, work to finalise the ALN Code and regulations has continued. These will be laid for approval before the Senedd in February 2021, ahead of the commencement of the ALN system over a three-year phased period from September 2021. Please see a timeline here.

The ALN statutory roles are to commence in January 2021, and guidance to support our delivery partners will be published. This guidance, based on text from the revised Code, will provide further clarity on the statutory roles by expanding on what already exists in the Additional Learning Needs and Education Tribunal (Wales) Act 2018.

As part of our ongoing work to support children and young people, families, their representatives and education practitioners, including in the context of the current pandemic, we have published <u>guidance on supporting vulnerable</u> and <u>disadvantaged learners</u>, including those with ALN, as schools and settings return to full operations.

You can find out more about the ALN transformation programme and guidance on the current SEN system <u>here</u> including our recently updated <u>frequently asked questions</u> and <u>ALN transformation programme guide</u>.

In addition, we have launched a <u>consultation</u> on proposals to allow representatives to act on behalf of young people, and parents of children, who lack mental capacity, when exercising their rights under the Additional Learning Needs and Education Tribunal (Wales) Act 2018. To ensure the consultation reaches the people the proposals will most affect, we will be working with Children in Wales to ensure young people who lack capacity are targeted and supported to engage with the consultation. This forms a crucial part of the work on the ALN code and regulations.
