Beyond Covid: Learning in the Next Phase

As we look forward to a welcome return to face-to-face teaching, Welsh Government is offering the opportunity to take part in a national online conversation. 
And to top it all off, you don't have to be a member of the Urdd to compete this year!

Competing will open on 1 March, and the Urdd will need to receive all performances or work by 26 March by uploading it to the website above.




