The aim of these sessions is to continue cluster discussions on developing a shared vision in the first workshop. Workshops 2 and 3 focus on Planning for Curriculum Change and follow on from the webinar that is available on 26 May, which considers the framework for the Curriculum for Wales. The workshops will follow the same format as the Change Management sessions with regular breakout opportunities for discussions.

We really hope that you will be able to attend these workshops and that it will be a valuable opportunity for you to further discuss the Reform Journey with your clusters.






