



TEDx GwE





A TEDx is a showcase event for speakers presenting great, well-informed ideas. The difference for our event is that the speakers will be our young people. Our goal is to bring pupils of all ages together to talk about the Climate Crisis and generate ideas that will make a huge difference.

We are hoping to showcase young people's ideas and issues from across the region talking about new and innovative projects that they have thought about to help combat the climate crisis. We hope this platform will help them to be heard and make leaders from across public, private and third sectors and communities sit up and take notice. We believe that our young people have the potential to inspire others and provoke conversations that matter. Wales is the first country in the world to legislate for sustainable development with the ground breaking Well-being of Future Generations (Wales) Act 2015. We want to build on this and the opportunity to make a long lasting, positive change to current and future generations with young people at the heart of driving these changes.

If you would like to be involved, here are two things you need to do:

- 1. Follow the link to register an interest. We will then send you a link to a resource pack of ideas
- 2. Send a 60 second video from pupils on Flipgrid (link will be available in the resource pack) with your idea, issues or focus and what your ask is of decision makers, leaders and the communities of North Wales. This can be groups and individuals of any age.

All the videos will be collected for leaders across North Wales to view.

We will host a filmed TEDx event on 1st November at Theatre Clwyd for a number of young people to have a live audience and stage to share their views. We will give support to develop the TED talk with some coaching and public speaking support. We will share the next stage in the process in September.

Numeracy Work with GwE Schools Published in US Journal

We were delighted to see the outcomes of one of our collaborative school improvement projects published recently. Over recent years, GwE has been working with the Collaborative Institute for Education Research, Evidence and Impact (CIEREI), Bangor University, to help large numbers of GwE schools use a fluency-based mathematics strategy called Say-All-Fast-Minute-Every-Day-Shuffled (SAFMEDS). Dr Kaydee Owen has pioneered this work for GwE over recent years and has provided valuable training and support for many GwE schools - the SAFMEDS strategy now forms a core part of our Accelerating Skills and mathematics support for schools. We were pleased to hear that Kaydee's SAFMEDS research was published last week in the leading US education journal, the *Journal of Research on Educational Effectiveness*. We'd also like to acknowledge the 63 schools in North Wales that participated in this trial and helped us to identify how we can enhance the quality of ongoing implementation support to improve the outcomes pupils achieve. Improving Pupils' Reading Fluency:

REPEATED READING AND HIGH FREQUENCY WORD STRATEGIES

These are two evidence informed fluency-building strategies designed and delivered in collaboration between GwE and reading experts from the Collaborative Institute for Education Research, Evidence and Impact (CIEREI), Bangor University to help learners in KS2 and KS3 who already have good decoding skills but need to improve their reading fluency in order to improve their comprehension skills. Mind Cymru Mental Health & Well-being Partnership Programme

The 4 Regional Education Consortia in collaboration with Mind Cymru are offering a facilitated (both in English and Welsh) virtual professional learning opportunity from September 2021 onwards:

Mental Health Awareness Session - For all clusters across the region

This is a 3-hour session to raise awareness of mental health that will also include a take-away pack delivered in groups of 16 delegates. We are targeting 1 or 2 individuals from every cluster across the region. The session is suitable for all staff within the cluster. However the delegates would become the Well-being Programme Partnership Champions, meeting with the Well-being Team bi-annually and providing a channel for programme developments, communications, resources and sources of support for dissemination to own cluster.

Mind - Managing Mental Health at work and supporting staff

This is a 3-hour facilitated session, plus a learner take-away pack, delivered to groups of 16 delegates in both Welsh & English.

This virtual session is targeted at School/Settings Senior Leadership Team Members/GwE and LA. This programme would be subject to evaluation and further cohorts dependent upon initial feedback.

Curriculum and assessment reforms. Survey: preparations for 2022

The Welsh Government has commissioned Arad Research and the Open University in Wales to carry out a survey on the preparations by schools and other settings to implement the curriculum and assessment reforms. The <u>survey</u> is aimed at head teachers, senior leaders and practitioners in schools and non-maintained settings in Wales delivering education. Responses will be used by Welsh Government to identify the type of support required to ensure schools are ready for the planned roll-out of the Curriculum for Wales from 2022. This is a 10-15 minute survey with a closing date of **16 July 2021**. <u>Click here</u> to take part.

Consultations on additional Curriculum for Wales guidance

Over the last year, practitioners and other stakeholders have been working to co-construct the specific additions to curriculum guidance signalled in January 2020. Welsh Government has also been preparing draft Codes in line with the requirements of the Curriculum and Assessment (Wales) Act 2021.

They invite your feedback on these drafts by **16 July** as part of our ongoing process of co-construction. Your inputs will be used by the practitioner working groups to help refine the drafts, before the Curriculum for Wales guidance is updated online in the autumn. Acorn Antics is back and will be open for registrations in September. Natural Resources Wales' (NRW) 'Acorn Antics Masterclass' webinar provides a step by step guide of what you need to do to take part in the 2021 campaign.

Growing native trees from local seed stock helps ensure that planted trees are best suited to local conditions and provide the greatest benefit to local wildlife and woodlands. To make sure Wales has plentiful stocks of these native, local trees, NRW are asking education and learning groups to collect acorns in their local area.

By giving you early warning of what's involved, NRW hopes you'll be able to weave some Acorn Antics into your planning, raise funds for your setting, help preserve this iconic tree species and get your learners learning in, learning about and learning for the natural environment.

Education groups based in Wales or anyone fundraising for their local Wales based education group are welcome to take part in this year's campaign.
