There will be an opportunity to discuss the issues at your local headteacher forums and with your Link Supporting Improvement Adviser in your clusters and individual schools.

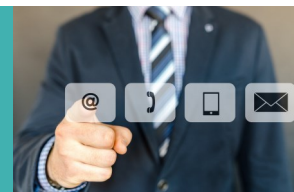

If you would like to be involved, here are two things you need to do:

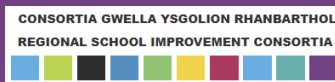
1. [Follow the link](#) to register an interest. We will then send you a link to a resource pack of ideas

Mind Cymru Mental Health & Well-being Partnership Programme

The 4 Regional Education Consortia in collaboration with Mind Cymru are offering a facilitated (both in English and Welsh) virtual professional learning opportunity from September 2021 onwards:

Sbarduno Workshops

Here's the current list of online and face to face workshops that Inspire by Sbarduno have to offer schools across North Wales during the Autumn Term.

The [online workshops](#) on offer are suitable for pupils from the Foundation Stage or Key Stage 2 and allow them to participate in an hour-long session of fun and simple experiments and develop skills such as teamwork, working independently and problem solving, as well as learning about day-to-day simple Science.

The cost for an hour-long session is £150 and it's suitable for up to 30 pupils. The workshops take place every Friday, and you can choose from 3 time slots: 09:30am; 11:00am or 01:15pm. It can be delivered either via Microsoft Teams or Google Meet, whichever you use at the school.

A list of required resources will be shared with you beforehand, and all the listed items are easily found. With regards to the Colours Workshop, you will receive the filter paper and pipettes in the post.

The [face-to-face workshop](#) is a whole day activity from 09:30-2:30pm for Key Stage 2, and is a half day workshop, 09:30-12:00pm for the Foundation Stage, and suitable for up to 30 pupils. The cost for the face-to-face workshop is £400. Travelling costs and accommodation (if required) will be extra. All resources required for the experiments will be supplied by Inspire by Sbarduno. Pupils will be allowed to wear laboratory coats to assist with enhancing the Science experiences.

An Opportunity to be Involved: Whole School Equity Project (Wales)
