'CONNECT' HEALTH & WELL-BEING STUDY



Are you looking to improve pupils' well-being?

We have identified a promising research-informed health and well-being programme called Connect for primary schools. Connect is delivered through termly themes and lessons and is carefully designed to improve primary school pupils' emotional well-being and resilience.

Why are we inviting schools to work with us?

We are now recruiting schools in North Wales to help us carry out an initial evaluation of Connect in 2022 to explore which training and support model might work best for teachers. The programme will be available in English and Welsh and this is an opportunity for schools to receive FREE training to deliver Connect.

What's involved for schools?

Key stage 2 teachers in participating classes will receive training to deliver *Connect*, including important information on the design and evidence base for the programme. Pupils will receive *Connect* sessions during the later part of the 2021-22 school year.

To take part in this study, your school must:

- Be a mainstream primary school in the GwE region interested in improving well-being provision
- Not currently be implementing other whole-school health and well-being curricula and/or interventions
