From September 2022, international languages will become a required part of the Curriculum for Wales for Year 5 and Year 6. Headteachers may choose how they approach the delivery of an international language and they may introduce an international language to earlier years if they so wish. This survey hopes to provide further understanding of the issues teachers may encounter. We are keen to hear from all primary schools, not just those where teaching of international languages is already taking place.
