Improving Pupils' Basic Numeracy Skills With SAFMEDS

We are recruiting teachers (or teaching assistants) in North Wales to work with a group of 10 learners in Year 3 or Year 4. Initially, the SAFMEDS sessions will focus on building addition skills, during the Autumn term 2023 and the Spring term 2024.

To be eligible to take part in this project your school:

- Must be a mainstream primary school in the GwE region (your school can be a Welsh, English or bilingual setting).
- Will need to identify target learners in Year 3 or Year 4 that will benefit from the SAFMEDS strategy. These learners will need a basic understanding of single digit addition (even if they are not yet fluent). Learners must also be able to turn flashcards independently.
- Will need to identify a teacher or teaching assistant who can attend the training session in October 2023. This should be the same member of staff that will support the SAFMEDS sessions in school.

Framework for evaluation, improvement and accountability

GUIDANCE ON THE SUMMARIES THAT SCHOOLS NEED TO PREPARE

'The school improvement guidance: framework for evaluation, improvement and accountability' has been issued by Welsh Government for school improvement which will become statutory in September 2024.

The guidance states an expectation for all schools to publish a summary for parents which shares information about the school's self-evaluation conclusions, progress against previous priorities, high-level improvement priorities and the external support a school will access to achieve its priorities.

In order to prepare for this expectation, a group of schools, in collaboration with GwE, have jointly created exemplars to support schools across the Region. We will be sharing the group's work in virtual Teams meetings at the following times:



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The sessions will be recorded and there will be an opportunity to discuss further with your Link Supporting Improvement Adviser as you consider the high-level priorities for your School Development Plan for the next academic year.

RADY – Raising the Attainment of Disadvantaged Youngsters

RADY is an approach to closing the gap which directly targets a school's 'central nervous system' – its target setting, tracking and monitoring systems. Unlike most other strategies to close the gap, RADY is aimed at school senior managers and teachers. RADY was developed on the Wirral in 2013 as a direct response to a hitherto unspotted flaw in school systems, which, if left unchecked, helps to maintain the gap and thwart efforts to reduce it.
