In Memory of Bethan James

Over the course of the new year there was a huge blow to the service, as we lost one of our colleagues and friend, Bethan James, frighteningly suddenly.

Bethan was a dear and supportive friend to many within the service and among school practitioners across the region. Her kindness was evident to all who knew her. She was very highly respected in her community in Bryncrug, Tywyn where she had settled. So too in her birthplace in Crwbin, Cwm Gwendraeth.

Her contributions within her community were very significant, she was always willing to help, she was wise and active in her community. But this is not a surprise at all to those of us who knew her, because that's how she was in her work too. She was an invaluable member of the team and will leave a huge void behind her.

Bethan's strength and talent as an adviser was her ability to translate theory into guidance and practical advice. Although she was an adviser by profession, Bethan was a woman of action, not a woman of words. She much preferred to roll up her sleeves and contribute practically. In every aspect of her work she was extremely conscientious, quietly effective and wise and empathetic in her guidance.

The pain and the anguish of losing Bethan will of course be felt most on the hearth of her parents' home. So too in her sister Catrin's household and her small family. And there will also be a void in the Bryncrug community, especially so in the Welsh society within that community.

As an inspiring teacher at Ysgol Uwchradd Tywyn, as a Humanities Consultant with Cynnal, as a Supporting Improvement Adviser with GwE and as an invaluable member of the Bryncrug and Crwbin communities - Bethan made a difference.

This is what one Adviser within the service who worked very closely with Bethan in recent years had to say "I will miss Bethan, her humility, her wit, her wisdom, her care and her friendship. She embodied the best of humanity."





Consultation: School Year Structure

HOW CAN WE MAKE THE SCHOOL YEAR MORE BALANCED FOR THE EDUCATION WORKFORCE. LEARNERS AND THEIR **FAMILIES?**

The Welsh Government is consulting on a proposal to change the structure of the school year to improve well-being, better support learning and ensure the school year is more closely aligned to how we live, learn and work today.

Proposals include the introduction of a two-week autumn break to improve staff well-being, a five-week summer break to allow for the longer autumn break and reduce potential 'learning loss' during the summer, and a break in the middle of the spring term not tied to Easter so that the workforce and learners have a more balanced term.

Any changes will not affect overall time spent in school, which will remain at 190 days with 13 weeks of school holidays.

Any changes would be from September 2025 at the earliest, meaning that the first two-week autumn break could be in 2025 and the first five-week summer break could be in 2026.

You may remember the case of Tom Channon, a college student who tragically died after falling about 70ft over a kneehigh wall in 2018 whilst on holiday with a group of friends celebrating the end of their A-Levels. Tom was a student at St David's Catholic College in Cardiff.

The college, in conjunction with Tom's parents, John and Ceri Channon, produced some resources aimed at learners aged 16-18 years to help increase young peoples' awareness of the need to prepare before going on holiday abroad [especially the first one without their families] and to better understand how to keep safe and avoid dangerous situations.

We agreed to bring these resources together, host them on Hwb and promote them to schools and colleges for use in pastoral studies programmes. The "Stay Aware, Stay Safe, Stay Together" campaign resources have been made into a Hwb playlist and can be used by schools and colleges in pastoral studies and tutorial programmes in the run-up to summer holidays. We would also encourage schools to share this with students via social media channels so they can take note before they go away.

The Coleg Cymraeg Cenedlaethol's scheme Dysgu'r Dyfodol, which aims to increase the number of people joining the Welsh-speaking education workforce, is running again this year - and they are now recruiting mentors to work on the scheme.

Dysqu'r Dyfodol offers mentoring sessions and work experience to undergraduate and postgraduate university students who speak Welsh in any subject discipline and who are interested in knowing more about a career as a school teacher.

The Coleg Cymraeg is looking for Welsh-speaking early-career teachers who work in Wales and have completed the Induction Period to be mentors.

The scheme will benefit early-career teachers by allowing them to:

- demonstrate development against the Professional Standards for teachers
- develop leadership skills
- earn up to £180 [£30 per hour for 6 hours of work: two hours of online training, three hours of online mentoring, and one hour of organisation]
