



Manipulatives and representations, when used effectively, can be a powerful tool to develop mathematical thinking and the five mathematical proficiencies.

This workshop, led by Jonathan Hall will define mathematical thinking and demonstrate its power through the use of concrete, pictorial and abstract representations - alongside carefully crafted prompts designed to hook learners in and engage. Practitioners will develop learners' curiosity and build and extend upon the prompts, leading to generalisations and a deeper conceptual understanding of the underlying structure of the mathematics.



European Parliament Ambassador Schools

Phil Lof a former student at Ysgol Eirias in Colwyn Bay and now working for the Welsh Government in their Brussels' Office wanted to share an opportunity that he thought might be of interest to schools in North Wales.

Following meetings with the European Parliament Liaison Office in London to discuss furthering collaboration between the European Parliament and Wales, the European Parliament London Office have expressed an interest in getting Welsh schools signed up to their European Parliament Ambassador School programme. As it stands, they don't have any schools in Wales signed up which is something they are keen to change.

As part of the programme both staff and students will receive a certificate upon completion. There is also the opportunity to get speakers from the European Parliament Liaison Office to visit the school as well as the chance to take students down to London to visit their office in Europe House. It is also worth noting that this is completely free for both the school and the students.

The Collaborative Evidence Network (CEN) research projects, which involved Higher Education Institutions and other organisations, looked at impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic on various aspects of the education system and on particular groups of learners.

The 18 projects also considered ways to mitigate those impacts, as well as ways practitioners and learners could be better supported moving forward.

The 6th seminar focuses on professional learning and initial teacher education. This includes an investigation of the impact of the pandemic on the professional learning needs of teachers in Wales as part of the Schools as Learning Organisations framework. It also includes an evaluation of the nature of online provision in Initial Teacher Education courses.


Child Poverty Strategy for Wales 2024

You may remember the case of Tom Channon, a college student who tragically died after falling about 70ft over a kneehigh wall in 2018 whilst on holiday with a group of friends celebrating the end of their A-Levels. Tom was a student at St David's Catholic College in Cardiff.

The college, in conjunction with Tom's parents, John and Ceri Channon, produced some resources aimed at learners aged 16-18 years to help increase young peoples' awareness of the need to prepare before going on holiday abroad [especially the first one without their families] and to better understand how to keep safe and avoid dangerous situations.

We agreed to bring these resources together, host them on Hwb and promote them to schools and colleges for use in pastoral studies programmes. The "Stay Aware, Stay Safe, Stay Together" campaign resources have been made into a Hwb playlist and can be used by schools and colleges in pastoral studies and tutorial programmes in the run-up to summer holidays. We would also encourage schools to share this with students via social media channels so they can take note before they go away.

The session will feature an introduction from Tom's parents, a brief overview of the resources themselves and a session from a school and FE college that have actually used the resources in sessions with learners.
