Effective use of manipulatives and representations (Primary 8-11)

Manipulatives and representations, when used effectively, can be a powerful tool to develop mathematical thinking and the five mathematical proficiencies.

This workshop, led by Jonathan Hall will define mathematical thinking and demonstrate its power through the use of concrete, pictorial and abstract representations - alongside carefully crafted prompts designed to hook learners in and engage. Practitioners will develop learners' curiosity and build and extend upon the prompts, leading to generalisations and a deeper conceptual understanding of the underlying structure of the mathematics.

European Parliament Ambassador Schools

Phil Lof, a former student at Ysgol Eirias in Colwyn Bay and now working for the Welsh Government in their Brussels' Office, wanted to share an opportunity that he thought might be of interest to schools in North Wales.

Following meetings with the European Parliament Liaison Office in London to discuss further collaboration between the European Parliament and Wales, the European Parliament London Office has expressed an interest in getting Welsh schools signed up to the European Parliament Ambassador School programme. As it stands, they don't have any schools in Wales signed up which is something they are keen to change.

As part of the programme both staff and students will receive a certificate upon completion. There is also the opportunity to get speakers from the European Parliament Liaison Office to visit the school as well as the chance to take students down to London to visit the office in Europe House. It is also worth noting that this is completely free for both the school and the students.
